Admission to Master of Science in Landscape Architecture

The Master of Science in Landscape Architecture Programme is organised as a self-financed programme of the Graduate School at The Chinese University of Hong Kong. The tuition fee is HK\$500,000 (subject to University's approval) for academic year 2027-28. This fee applies to a normative period of 24 months for full-time students and 48 months for part-time students. The places for the programme are given based on the academic and professional merit of the application.

Application Deadlines for 2027 entry: 15 January 2027 (First Round) / 21 May 2027 (Second Round)

Application Requirements and Procedures

1. Applicants should have an undergraduate degree in Landscape Studies or a related area recognised by the country where the school is located, normally achieving an average grade of not lower than "B".
2. To fulfill the English Language Proficiency Requirement for admission, applicant should have (More detailed information requirement please refer to [Graduate School website](#)):
 - a) Obtained a degree from a university in Hong Kong or taken a degree programme of which the medium of instruction was English; or
 - b) Achieved scores in the following English Language tests as indicated:
 - TOEFL: 79 of 120 / 4.5 of 6 (Internet-based/Home Edition);
 - IELTS (Academic): 6.5 (Test Centre based/Online);
 - GMAT: Band 21 (Verbal);
 - GMAT Focus Edition: Band 78 (Verbal); or*(*TOEFL and IELTS scores are considered valid for two years from the test date. GMAT scores are considered valid for five years from the test date. GMAT (Verbal) Score with a threshold of 21 will be kept until the score validity expires.)*
 - c) Obtained a pass grade in English in one of the following examinations:
 - Hong Kong Advanced Level Examination (AS Level);
 - Hong Kong Higher Level Examination;
 - CUHK Matriculation Examination;
 - General Certificate of Education Examination (GCE) Advanced Level (A-Level) /Advanced Subsidiary Level (AS-Level); or
 - d) Achieved Level 4 or above in the English Language subject of the Hong Kong Diploma of Secondary Education (HKDSE) Examination; or
 - e) Obtained a recognized professional qualification, provided that the examination was conducted in English.
3. **Statement of Purpose (400 – 650 words)**
 - a) Our program is founded on the principle of Landscape as Agency: the conviction that landscape architecture is a creative, responsible, and powerful form of intervention. In your statement, please explain how your personal background, academic journey, and professional or life experiences have prepared you to become an agent of change. Rather than merely stating your interest in the field, we encourage you to demonstrate your thought process. The essay must be entirely your own work.
 - b) **Answers to Short Questions (150 – 200 words)**

Our program is designed to cultivate leaders who are critical thinkers, proactive doers, and visionary innovators. To gain insight into your unique perspective and ambitions, please select and respond to ONE of the following three questions:

 - i. Identify a specific public space or ecosystem in your community that is underperforming or neglected. What single, critical intervention would you propose to begin its transformation, and why?



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- ii. Describe a real-world scenario where the needs of 'People' (e.g., housing, economic development) and 'Nature' (e.g., habitat preservation, ecological function) appear to conflict. How would you, as a landscape architect, begin to reframe the problem to find a solution where both can thrive?
 - iii. Our students are empowered to launch new initiatives. If you were given the resources to start one green enterprise or non-profit project today, what pressing problem would it solve?

Grading Scheme

If your university do not have a grading scheme, please ask for a certifying letter from University Registry indicating that your programme do not have grading scheme.

Design Portfolio

The portfolio of independent work should illustrate independent studies and your own work from practical experience and should be accompanied by a commentary of not more than 1500 words. The portfolio should not exceed A4 size and no more than 20 pages (include the cover and content page). It should be selected to fit best to the materials which you want to present. In general, the portfolio should inform in a concise way about your school and practical work. It should not be a loose collection of material; but be clearly structured to reflect your educational and practical experiences. Proper credit and context must be given for all work shown including author, collaborators, and professional office in which the work was completed. Failure to properly credit work may result in the portfolio being discounted or the applicant being disqualified. Please put down your full name on the front cover of the portfolio for ease of identification.

Portfolios of (a) previous school work and (b) independent work with your full name and application number marked on the cover should be **uploaded** to the School of Architecture [application materials collection platform](#) no later than **15 January 2027 (First Round)** or 21 May 2027 (Second Round). **No Hardcopy is accepted.**



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Design Portfolio Requirements:

- i. Cover
 - Clearly indicate your full name and application number on the cover of the portfolio for easy identification
 - Include the date and the program to which you are applying
- ii. Format
 - Submit the portfolio as a PDF file, smaller than 30MB
 - Use A4 size with a maximum of 20 pages.
- iii. Content
 - a. Personal Statement
 - b. CV
 - c. A maximum of 5 projects, with at least 3 being academic
 - Each project must have a clear title.
 - For each project, indicate the nature of the project (e.g., academic, competition, professional, workshop, etc.), along with the names of all collaborators, instructors, or employers (including names, positions, affiliations, and emails).
 - Clearly articulate your specific contributions to any group or professional work. Additionally, cite any text or images that were not produced by you.
 - Organise projects in chronological order, listing the most recent project first. Include architectural drawings (plans, sections, etc.).
 - Provide evidence of the design process, highlighting the rationale behind each project.
 - Please do not submit models of physical artifacts.
- iv. Credit and Plagiarism
 - Proper credit and context must be given for all work shown in the portfolio, including authors, collaborators, and professional offices in which the work was completed
 - Failure to credit work properly or appropriating other people's work is a serious offence and may result in the portfolio being discounted or the applicant being disqualified
